"I know I can't reach everybody, but at least maybe they can get a candy bar or something," said Zank. "It gets expensive but it is worth it." She pays for most of the items out of her own pocket. Postage to either Afghanistan or Iraq costs \$8.10 for a letter and \$13 for a 28-pound box. Zank's also received some help from the Friends of the Flat River Community Library, the Hurst Funeral Home, St. Paul's Episcopal Church, the Thalia Club and several individuals and businesses.
